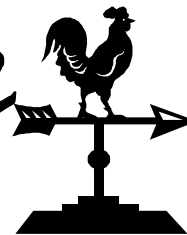

In a little patch of grass a baby bird was struggling to fly. I watched it flutter its baby wings and considered several options of baby bird rescue. My mind raced seeking a practical option as the little wings beat hard against the ground. "Let nature take care of it" ran through my mind along with "if you touch it the mother will hurt it" and wondering if either would really happen and wishing all the while that I had never looked over there.

I glanced away but just had to look back. This time, there was another small bird on the ground beside it. As I was feeling relief, the second little bird took a hop and flew off to my right. And behind it the former struggler hopped once and flew off.

There is a great truth from nature in that event: *it only takes a little help to make a huge difference.* Without the second baby bird, would the first have survived? I contemplated that scene most of the afternoon and came to the realization that there are distinct parallels in my own life. And on occasion I have witnessed how a little encouragement becomes the very model toward wise decisions merging life and faith.

On this beautiful clear morning, I have realized the truth that I am asking our Weatherly family to become the encouraging baby bird. With your support and help you can enable our Chapel (youth) choir make their summer tour to St. Louis without financial stress on any family. I'm counting on you to help our birds take flight and soar with a singing faith.
